However, the Auxiliary is always up to working with the VFW members doing an event to help them make it successful.

National Commander-in-Chief Al Lipphardt and National Auxiliary President, Brenda Bryant are trying to strengthen the gap between the VFW and its Auxiliary, and I hope that Maurice and I can do our part to make Illinois strong and cohesive with separation where it is needed, with our leadership.


The end of the calendar year is near but our year doesn't end until June 30.

# National Auxiliary President Brenda Bryant Visits Illinois

On Aug. 15-16, the Department of Illinois had the pleasure of hosting VFW Auxiliary National President Brenda Bryant.

Unfortunately, she was unable to stay for our Auxiliary Council of Administration meeting and the Homecoming festivities, but we did pack in a lot in the brief time she was with us.

Our August Council meeting was held in Fairview Heights, which allowed for several sight-seeing adventures nearby. Upon arriving in St. Louis on Thursday, and a quick stop at the hotel, NP Brenda was escorted to the Collinsville VFW Post 5691 for a "meet and greet" with both VFW and Auxiliary members.

She spoke to us about her special project Operation Bot-tom Cover, which will provide diapers for the babies of our military and veterans, and the importance of working with the VFW.

On Aug. 16, our Illinois delegation, which included both VFW and Auxiliary members, met outside the gates of Scott Air Force Base, located a short distance away near Belleville. In addition to our VFW Auxiliary National President Brenda Bryant, we were also joined by Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief Tim Peters, who was represent-ing the Commander-in-Chief at the VFW Council meeting.

Illinois VFW State Commander Maurice Bridges, who retired from the 126th Air Re-fueling Wing in the Illinois Air National Guard, was able to arrange a tour of a KC-135 Stratotanker.

We were escorted onto the base, into the hangar and were given full access, inside and out, of the KC-135, which made for some great photo ops. After the tour and a quick lunch stop, we made our way around to some "historical landmarks".

Our first stop was to the Brooks Catsup Bottle Water Tower in Collinsville, which is trademarked as the "World's Largest Catsup Bottle", and could theoretically hold 640,000 bottles of catsup. Next, we stopped at the Route 66 Shield
